Commissioner Activities

Heart & Hands Pediatric Clinic - Lakeside Academy

- On November 7th, I had the privilege of attending the Grand Opening of the second
 <u>Heart & Hands Pediatric School Clinic</u> at Lakeside Academy, the first clinic opened at
 Verdun Elementary School. The school clinic is an LBPSB and McGill University initiative
 that embodies holistic community health by starting where it matters most—at school,
 the next best place to home. This ecosystem brings together community-centered
 learning for resident physicians. Quebec English-speaking Communities Research
 Network (QUESCREN)
- On November 14th, I attended Lunch & Learn on Busting Myths and Building Bridge.
 We were presented with the research done by the Office of the Commissioner of
 Official Languages (OCOL-CLO) regarding the myths and misconceptions that
 Quebecers and Canadians have about English speakers and bilingualism in Quebec, and
 bilingualism in Canada.

- There remain many misconceptions about the English-speaking community in Quebec. I have attached an infographic with a few facts about the Englishspeaking community from the OCOL presented at the meeting.
- QUESCREN is an alliance of researchers, community members, and institutions that develops research capacity in English-speaking Quebec.

Quebec English School Boards Association (QESBA)

- QESBA advocates for appropriate English institutional education for students in both
 the youth and adult sectors and to enhance the effectiveness of school commissioners
 and member school boards in the areas of education, finance, administration and
 labour relations to fulfill the needs of school boards.
- On October 24, 2024, I attended QESBA's first Community Engagement Award ceremony in the name of Liberal MNA and cabinet minister Kathleen Weil and her husband, former Chambre de Commerce de Montréal President Michael Novak.
 Former Quebec Premier Jean Charest was the keynote where he raised awareness about the provincial legislation aimed at abolishing Quebec English public school boards.
- November 30th will be the AGA, and professional development for Commissioners.

<u>Bill 40</u> was adopted in the National Assembly in 2020 and turned school boards into school service centres.

- Less than six months later, <u>parts of the bill that applied to English boards were</u> <u>suspended by the Quebec Superior Court</u> with a stay of legislation while a legal challenge made its way through the court.
- On August 2, 2023, the nine English boards won the first round in Superior Court, where the legislation was deemed unconstitutional.
 - In his ruling, Justice Sylvain Lussier said English school boards in Quebec have the right to manage their schools and that the bill went too far to try to abolish them.
 - ** IMPORTANT ** The government appealed the judgement and the appeal
 will be heard in January in the Quebec Court of Appeal.

o Teachers' Report:

Kindergarten-4	We have been busy this month. We continue to work on Fall themed activities. We read many fall themed books . Emily Miller will be coming in to do a parent workshop on November 20th at 6pm. Emily will be presenting "Handling Big Emotions". We are finishing up our fall theme and we will be slowly starting our winter theme.
Kindergarten-5	In French kindergarten, we have participated in projects related to Halloween and Fall. The children have been acquiring new French vocabulary through these subjects. In French and English the children have been working together building structures with various building materials. These activities are helping them develop their social, emotional and motor skills.
Grade 1	In ELA, students have been working on their letter sounds and CVC words as well as making short sentences. Using proper sentence structure has been introduced and encouraged in their writing skills.
	This week we will begin our Holidays theme.
	In Math, students have just finished Theme 2 of their math book which involved concepts such as <,>,=, increasing and decreasing numbers, addition and subtraction as well as spatial relationships.
	En français, nous avons fini les sons des voyelles et on commence les sons ou, oi et on. Les enfants ont fait un livre de classe, Tu lis où? 	In French we are working on our history À La Trace book. We have also begun our first science experiment (decomposing 2 pumpkins, hypothesizing and recording the results). We continue to work on grammar (les classes de mots), writing work and will be completing listening comprehensions based off of a French podcast for kids.
Grade 561	We are working on a bilingual Dragon's Den project where student create their own invention to solve an every day problem. We will be starting to learn about fractions in Math and learning about response to literature in English. In French we are continuing to work on comprehension by watching a TV show for kids called Marika.
