Interim Report	On October 15, you will receive the interim report
Term 1 Report Card	Term 1 Report Card will be issued on November 24 . This report card will cover the period from September 2 to November 14. It will count for 20% of the final mark for the year.
Term 2 Report Card	Term 2 Report Card will be issued on March 12 . This report card will cover the period from November 17 to February 20. It will count for 20% of the final mark for the year.
Term 3 Report Card	Term 3 Report Card will be issued on June 23 . This report card will cover the period from February 23 to June 23. It will count for 60% of the final mark for the year.
Student Portfolios	Portfolio Evening will be held on March 26 .

Report Card Results

MELS – Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport

Term 1 – 20% of Final Mark	For Terms 1 and 2, the teacher enters a percentage mark that reflects the knowledge and competencies that a student has acquired based on the evaluations carried out during the term (tests, assignments, etc.)
Term 2 – 20% of Final Mark	



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	In the case of English Language Arts, Mathematics and French, Second Language, a Subject Mark is calculated on the basis of the weightings assigned to the subject-specific competencies established by MELS (see subject table on the first page).
Term 3 – 60% of the Final Mark	For Term 3, the teacher enters a percentage mark that covers the student's learning as a whole for the year (knowledge and competencies).
Final Mark	<p>Term 3 includes a Final Mark.</p> <p>It is calculated using the results of the three weighted terms: 20% - 20% - 60% - and the MELS exam results (if applicable).</p> <p>The MELS exam counts for 20% of the Final Mark.</p> <p>Only applies in Cycle 3 English Language Arts and Mathematics.</p>
Other Report Card Information	<p>Comments on Learning (by Subject) The report card will include a section for general teacher comments for each subject. The comments will deal with the student's strengths, challenges and progress.</p> <p>General Competencies The report cards will also include comments on the following general competencies at the end of term: Term 1: Student organizes work Term 3: Student communicates effectively</p>
